We have a reserve fund line item to manage this year - \$8500 for grounds maintenance equipment (handout from Doug); Doug proposes a subcommittee to look at equipment needs (Doug, Nartano, Brent).

### • Summer Interns Proposal Michael/Helen

Helen sent out the proposal by email.

Organic farms often get interns in trade for room and board. One concern is liability insurance; Journeys has experience with this so can we have a partnership? (Yes) Proposal is for two interns mid-June to mid-September (3 months) to help Journeys and work in the garden on growing and preserving. Journeys supports the idea. Marnie (NES prospector) has interest in designing an educational program which could include supervising the interns. Next step is to go to FFF to discuss details. Brian had some editing suggestions – group discussion of various issues.

Will want to purchase scion wood and other plants/seeds as season progresses.
