Oven – last year's has been deconstructed. New one will need a roof, going near the currant bush in the NE corner. May need to move the currant. Use the driveway brick pile?

Bamboo dome – how to get it finished? Want to finish before summer solstice.

Black tubs/cherry tomatoes – looking for options on where to put them this year instead of next to Dorothy's house. Try east end of the NE garden quadrant.
