Aborist Bid - \$1150 work on 3 trees

Red Malple - at east end of Guest parking Paved

Cherry Tree - next to paved parking add cable and trim

Hazelnut tree – leans on barn roof

Other things we might want to ask – aspen with crack near Brian's House

Should we look at other tree folks to look for a better price?

Trees & Journeys & Yurt

Journeys is ready to take down a Yurt, and put in a new Yurt close to the property line, back where the nettles are growing.

Brian suggests removal of 3 trees, one to make space for the Yurt.

Who would pay? Songaia? Maybe Journeys would pay, part in liue of rent.

Is it OK to remove trees? New bid form Trees for Life

Decision – OK to remove 2 trees Consensed

Journeys will look into a bid (if desiered)

Recommend that Journeys pay for tree removal, and reduction in rent "in kind".

Food Waste and Rats

Nartano's Idea – 5 gallon buckets in a wire cage?

Rat traks on fabric (in celing of common house), shelves on sides sheet rock leaves a gap, and rats have dug through insulation in celing.

Worm casting – to the pad next to the Dumpsters

Maybe 5 gallon buckets, or 30 gallon Trash Cans? Buy 4 30gallon metal trash cans.

Let's try Buying 3 - 4 Meatal Trash cans with lids. Move the garbage and the worm castings to the trash pad. Possibly extend concreet pad.

Drivers actually like placing the dumpsters on the ground next to the concreet.

Make seed balls (get clay on Friday) and mix with soil

Potting Shed Roof

Replace fiber glass with clear polycarbonate

Douglas Report: \$1400 if we do it ourselves

Bob Lewis would do all the work \$4500 . . doesn't include fixing the joists.

Doug will look for another bid. . .

Bindweed mentioned as a problem in Community Meeting

Douglas suggests we "stay ahead of it", and work pretty hard on it every year.

Piglets do consistanty work on bindweed.

North Food Forest – maybe a community bindweed pull?

Maybe use vollunteers from UW.

Rabbit Fence – maybe a cement footer (6 inches above and below ground)

Bindweed is in the meadow . . . cause for concern.

Fence reinforcement

weekly fence patrols (rabits are chewing through fence) fence is working pretty well – mosty is keeping rabbits out.

Suggest we have a Sat workday after next house meeting (add a layer of netting).

Permaculture Curriclum

Design principles – working on this the next few weeks. Upcoming interns have the interest in infrastucture.

Planning a rain garden/water catchment plan for common house towards the garden.

Possibly make cob pizza oven, but need to "secure" the slope, water & drainage, Possibly see if Interns want to do some "paid" work building the potting shed roof. Maybe ask Nartano (Radient Results) to bid on it and use paid labor of interested interns???
